

#### Cumulative Index to Volumes 14-21, 1974-91

This index is a sequel to the index to volumes 1-13 published in 1974. The latter supplemented the individual indexes which appeared at the end of each volume. As no individual indexes have been included since then, this new index differs in scale and purpose from its predecessor.

Because of constraints on size, precedence has been given to East Lothian references over regional or national events and figures. The citation order has been subject before place e.g. 'mills, Gifford' rather than 'Gifford mills'. The numbers in italics are the volume numbers, those in roman the page numbers. Titles of articles are included, prefixed by an asterisk.

Names of ordinary individuals have been fairly comprehensively indexed in acknowledgement of the interest of family historians. A marked difference in content from the first cumulative index is indicative of changing historical concerns, social and economic matters featuring more prominently than the names of famous men, monuments and mansions.
